I understand that when Holland House playground was originally built, the new build development did not exist. However, I strongly suggest that this refurbishment should take into account the presence of the new build homes and make improvements accordingly.</p> <p>Here are the aspects of the playground that I am currently satisfied with:</p> <p>The toddler slide and swings are very suitable for toddlers. Every day, when I open my window curtains, I feel happy seeing parents playing together with their toddlers.</p>	<p>Here are the aspects of the playground that I am not very satisfied with: 1. The current playground surface is covered with wood chips, which have become a tool for juniors and teens to "attack" each other. Every day, I see juniors or teens not playing on the playground equipment but instead throwing wood chips at one another. Sometimes, when they are overly excited, they throw the chips toward my garden. It is not just single chips, they throw them in large quantities, and all the wood chips end up on my garden and skylights. Sometimes, they even include branches collected nearby in the playground. This problem is more worse in summer, when longer daylight hours give more opportunities for throwing. Suggestion: Replace the wood chip surface with safety rubber mats. This would prevent children from being hit by wood chips thrown by others and reduce the chance of wood chips being used as "toys" thrown into residents' homes.</p> <p>2. The yellow bench near the residences is too close to the new build homes. Its original intention may have been for parents/residents to rest, but based on my four years of living here, juniors and teens often like to climb onto this bench to look into my home, which seriously infringes on the privacy of me and my family.</p> <p>Additionally, they sometimes gather there late at night, talking loudly and smoking. They occasionally throw cigarette butts, lighters, food packaging, and drinks into our garden instead of using bins, affecting our safety, health, sleeping quality and peace of mind. Suggestion: Move the yellow bench away from the new build homes and add another bench and bin on the grassy side.
