Unfortunately it is very difficult to read the above notes. no 1 footpath was promised when the large housing estate was allowed to be built. Promises by the council to have traffic calming along Longmeanygate has not come to fruition despite having planning permission since January 2024. It is extremely difficult and dangerous to walk along Longmeanygate to Roadtrain Ave because of traffic including HGVs hence the fact this footpath is essential. Any screening of the large 'ugly' housing estate would be a bonus after the builders cut trees and destroyed wildlife habitat. I like all of the areas where you have left the grass uncut; it really improves the natural aspect of the park. I think that the balance between cut grass and natural areas is spot on.	I don't like the way that the park has been neglected. In winter, the footpaths are a mess. Most of the entrance gates are broken. Possibly the worst sign of neglect is the amount of ivy that is hanging from trees. When trees have fallen, the branches are just left by the side of the footpath. They then become covered in nettles or brambles. The length of park along Robin Hey has always been a dumping ground for garden and household waste. There is still anti social behaviour, motor bikes, dog walkers leaving poo on the ground or throwing the bag into the bushes.	I think that all of the plans as presented are good, especially the new footpaths into Centurion village.	Most of the tree work is along the northern edge of the park, I would like to see all of the very large F1 hybrid poplar trees, behind Greystones and Paradise Lane, cut down. I don't think that they have a place in a public park. I would like to see better drainage by cleaning out existing ditches but also by creating a series of swales through the woodland part of the park. (like you have done in the area behind Bobby the horse. Saying that, I would like to see the ditch along side the boundary to Robin Hey filled in and cleared so that it isn't an easy area to dump rubbish.
